Pruned trees, thinned-out bamboo, and trees downed by typhoons at National SHOWA KINEN PARK are carefully selected, re-imagined, recreated, and then exhibited based on the idea of reviving fallen trees as works of art before being returned to the soil as chips.

It took almost six months to collect the materials, create the designs, and drawings, and set up the exhibition.
